

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CEMETERY CORPORATIONS ACCEPTABLE TO THE DIVISION OF CEMETERIES AS BEING IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE LAW

All lots in the Tyrone Union Cemetery are sold in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of New York and shall not be used for any other purposes than as a burial place for dead human beings.

No interment shall be allowed without permission being first obtained from the Tyrone Union Cemetery Association. At the time of applying for permission, the following information must be furnished:

- Name of deceased.
- Age of deceased - including date of birth, if known.
- Last known address (City, Town, Village, State)
- Date of death.
- Date of interment.
- If not an adult - the names of parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of deceased.

Lot owners are prohibited from allowing interments to be made on their lots for compensation.

Interments in a lot are restricted to those entitled to burial therein according to the terms of Section 1512 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law. Permission for burial of those not entitled to burial according to the said Section, must be filed with Tyrone Union Cemetery Association by the lot owner(s).

Except as provided for in Section 1513(c) of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law, no lot owner may transfer his or her lot.

The full purchase price must be paid before a deed will be given or burial allowed on the lot.

The Tyrone Union Cemetery Association reserves the right to remove all flowers, wreaths, or other decorations from the lots as soon as they become unsightly. All plantings, annual and perennial flowers, small shrubs must be planted only against the front or sides of a monument and kept neat and trimmed. All flower pots, solar lights, flags and flag stands, and other adornments must be placed against the monument or foundation. Nothing is to be placed or planted to the rear of the monument. Nothing will be placed on the main part of the grave which would interfere with mowing and maintenance. Planters may be placed on the graves on May 1st and must be removed by November 1st of each year. It is the responsibility of those placing planters to water and attend them. Anything left to die, fade or become unsightly may be removed by the Cemetery Association. Holiday decorations must be removed within two weeks of the holiday end.

The Tyrone Union Cemetery Association reserves the right to remove, after due notice to the lot owner, any monument, mound, mausoleum, embellishment on the lot, effigy or inscription which, in the opinion of the majority of the trustees or directors, is unsightly or dangerous.

The Tyrone Union Cemetery Association reserves the right to restrict the planting of shrubs and trees and to remove any shrub or tree deemed dangerous to the public, upon due notice to the lot owner. No trees are to be planted without prior approval of the Tyrone Union Cemetery Association.

All funerals, processions and vehicles will be under the control of the superintendent while in the cemetery.

No vault or mausoleum shall be built above ground without the permission of the board of directors and then only in such location as they may approve.

No mausoleum will be approved for construction by the board of directors unless a sufficient endowment is set up to provide adequate income to maintain the structure.

No monuments or markers shall be permitted which utilize colors other than those of natural stone.

Placing of glass blocks or vases as receptacles for flowers, either artificial or grown, on graves or plots, is prohibited.

All foundations will be constructed by or under the direction of the Tyrone Union Cemetery Association.

All work done in the cemetery shall be done by cemetery employees or under the control or with the permission of the superintendent or board of directors.

Monuments are restricted in size to dimensions which will not cover more than ten percent of the surface area of the lot. Every monument shall be at least four inches in thickness.

The bases of all monuments shall be finished true and level so as to fit on foundations without wedging or sprawls.

No monument will be allowed to be delivered in the cemetery until the foundation is installed and ready to receive the monument.

Heavy trucking or other vehicular traffic shall be refused entrance to the cemetery when, in the opinion of the superintendent, injury to roads and driveways might result. There shall be no driving of vehicles on grave sites and lawns except on adjacent shoulders of established roads or when otherwise directed by cemetery or funeral personal. The use of ATVs, snowmobiles and motorcycles on cemetery property is prohibited.

All persons shall be allowed to the cemetery during daylight hours, observing the rules which are in effect and propriety due the cemetery. The cemetery shall be closed from 8:00 p.m. - 8:00 a.m. daily.

All monuments or markers must be constructed of granite, bronze or stone. Granite bench memorials may be placed in lieu of head stones and end of bench may not be wider than plot(s) it is located on. It must be in the row of headstones facing the grave site, and standing on 6" reinforced concrete slab of same dimensions. It may have plants or planters on ends if lot(s) size allows.

Only on upright (above ground level) monument per plot(s) and one flush grade level monument on each plot. All monuments shall be set in accordance with the general plan of the cemetery and shall conform to said plan in size and material.

Disinterments will be allowed between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. provided the provisions of Section 1510(e) of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law are complied with.

Interments on Sundays and holidays will be governed by Cemetery Board Directives 202.8 and 202.12.

All lot owners are required to notify the cemetery of any change in address. All notices required to be sent shall be sent to the last recorded address and such notices shall be deemed adequate.

Cremated remains will not be permitted to be scattered in any part of the cemetery.

Concrete vaults or concrete grave liners will be required for interments in all graves purchased on or after January 1, 1985, in accordance with the provisions of Cemetery Board Directive 202.6.

The interment of cremated remains will be permitted only in appropriate rigid receptacles such as wood, metal, plastic or concrete.

Only one human remain and one cremated remain will be permitted in each grave or two cremated remains per grave.

Winter burials are permitted in the Tyrone Union Cemetery per NYS law. All additional charges for snow removal/sanding will be the responsibility of the funeral home/family of the deceased. Any damages to cemetery property/grounds may be assessed also. Additional costs for digging in frozen ground may also be assessed by cemetery contractor.

These rules and regulations may be amended by the directors of said Tyrone Union Cemetery Association, but no such amendments shall be effective until approved by the New York State Cemetery Board.
