### RESOLUTION NO. 04, 2017

# RE: GOVERNOR CUOMO'S PROPOSED LOCAL GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY PROGRAM:

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Aid and Incentives to Municipalities program (the "AIM"), New York State provides unrestricted, general fund aid money to New York's cities, towns and villages; and

WHEREAS, AIM funds are an integral part of the budget for New York's municipalities, as they are necessary to provide some measure of offset to the costs incurred by these municipalities due to the onerous and burdensome unfunded mandates imposed by New York State on its municipalities: and

WHEREAS, the Executive Budget for 2017-18 proposed by Governor Cuomo includes an requirement that AIM funding be conditioned upon the enactment by the State Legislature of an amendment to the State's Municipal Home Rule Law that would require county governments to prepare "efficiency plans" for sharing services within their counties for approval by the county's voters: and

WHEREAS, the nearly all of the real property tax dollars paid in New York State go to school districts and to pay for State-mandated programs and services, neither of which would be affected by the required "efficiency plans"; and

WHEREAS, as such, while New York's municipalities recognize that sharing of services and other efficiencies are a necessary part of local government operations, and real tax savings generated as a result of the plans required by the Governor's proposal would be relatively miniscule, and , worse, the Governor's requirement amounts essentially to yet another unfunded mandated foisted upon the State's municipalities:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Board of the Town of Tyrone that the Board is opposed to the Governor's proposal as described above, and any similar plans that would condition AIM funding on additional State-mandated actions to be taken by New York's municipalities.

(8) County Legislator: Dennis Fagan reported that for the first time in 13 years

that we may not be granted to permit from the DEC for the lake treatments. Dennis will continue to pursue this.

(9) Lakes Association: Cartha Conklin had nothing new to add.

(10) Other: Several members of the public commented on the current situation with the Highway Superintendent.
